

Research Findings from the American Diabetes Association

Your support for research will someday bring a cure for diabetes! The American Diabetes Association is so thankful for your contributions to research. You recently funded, Dr. Greg Morton from the University of Washington and his work in defining the role of the brain in control of glucose. Below is an excerpt from his final report:

Dr. Greg Morton:

The incidence and prevalence of diabetes is increasing and is a growing health concern, given that it is associated with increased risk for diabetes-related complications including kidney disease, cardiovascular disease, cancer, and amputation. Even with currently available therapies, the control and management of blood glucose levels remains a challenge in T2D patients and can thereby increase the risk of diabetes-related complications. My research career has focused on understanding how blood glucose levels are regulated and what contributes to the development of diabetes. This research will provide insights into the role of the brain in the control of blood glucose levels and has potential to facilitate the development of novel approaches to diabetes treatment.

Growing evidence suggests that there is a relationship between ambient temperature and risk of obesity and diabetes. This concept is of interest, in part owing to the identification of brown adipose tissue (BAT), a thermogenic tissue, in adult humans, and the associated interest in BAT thermogenesis as a target for the treatment of obesity and diabetes. In further support of this, epidemiological studies reveal

that the prevalence of diabetes and glucose intolerance increase with higher outdoor temperatures and that either short-term or intermittent cold exposure can improve glucose homeostasis in both rodents and humans. Our findings identify key neurons in the brain that link thermoregulation to both energy- and glucose-homeostasis and further show that obesity is a state characterized by a partial uncoupling of energy homeostasis from the thermoregulatory system. By shedding light on this coupling process and its obesity-associated impairment, this work will shed new light on mechanisms underlying both normal energy homeostasis and obesity pathogenesis, major risk factors for the development of T2D.

This work has the potential to fundamentally advance our understanding of how the brain regulates blood glucose levels and to identify novel targets for the treatment of T2D.

I am so thankful for this funding as this research success and the high-impact publications supported by this Award supported my recent promotion to Professor of Medicine, within the Division of Metabolism, Endocrinology and Nutrition at the University of Washington as well as the advancement of several other researchers involved in this work.

The grant may be over, but the work continues until there is a cure. Thank you.




