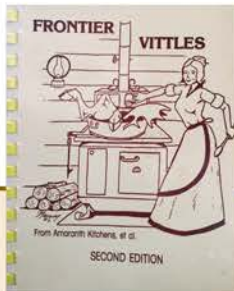

Strawberry Bread

|---|----------------|
| 4 eggs (well beaten) | 3 c flour |
| 2 c sugar | 1 tsp soda |
| 1 ¼ c oil | 1 tsp cinnamon |
| ½ tsp strawberry flavoring | ¼ tsp salt |
| 2 (10 oz) pkgs strawberries frozen with juice | |
| ¾ c pecans | |

Mix eggs, sugar, oil and flavoring. Add dry ingredients and fold in strawberries. Add pecans if desired. Batter will be runny, like cake batter. Bake 350 for 1 hour. Makes 2 loaves.

Hello Oregon Amaranth!

This month I had the opportunity to be part of supporting Emerald Court in performing one of the most beautiful memorial ceremonies that I have seen in some time.

As many know, Emerald is a small but growing Court with several new members that are just being introduced to our beautiful ritual and floor work. Three of these new members were just installed into their very first offices in April and one, in particular, into the very important position of Marshal in the East!

Imagine back when you were brand new in the Order of the Amaranth...was there someone that stepped up and in to help you learn the ritual and floor work? Did you have a positive experience from those interactions that included grace, patience, and a nurturing nature while learning?

Having someone to guide and support you is key to a new person's success and even more important in our ability to retain those members in our organization! We are a volunteer organization and retention is entirely dependent on the quality of our members experience within our Courts. This meeting we had several members come from around the state to support Emerald with their Memorial meeting which not only provided further connections for this up and growing Court but it also allowed some of these members to see a full core of officers participating in opening, closing, and Memorial for the very first time. Seeing and hearing all of the officer's parts and where they are on the floor, I'm sure, was very educational for them and helped them see how it all looks and functions when you have more members. As we got towards Memorial, we took a few moments to highlight and walk through some of the key elements of Memorial to make it beautiful and well timed. With the quick instruction, we started into Memorial with the understanding that we would do our best and that is all we ask of one another. Yes, there were still nerves but we did our best to help build up confidence and assurance. We had paired up each of the new members with a strong, experienced partner that could support and guide them through the ceremony. Between the instruction, the willingness to try from the Court and the support of a core of seasoned members in attendance we started into Memorial.

"What's in it for me?" Many people never verbalize this statement, but you can bet they are thinking about it. They are thinking about how limited their time is in the hustle and bustle of modern life with the constant demands for instant gratification.

A person may ask you "why" they should join the Order. This is a critical point in the communication and you should tread carefully in your response. Things like, WE need you, are terrible answers. Instead, put aside your history and involvement and look at this from their eyes. I see a small organization that seems to perform a lot of fundraisers and they usually seem to be happy and enjoy each other's company. So, let's focus on that.

"Well let me tell you why. Like all Masonic organizations, we are always working to improve the lives of others and help our communities. Our focus has been on supporting diabetes research. This is a horrible disease that touches one-in-three people directly or through a family member.

"But let's talk about you and why you should join. Social scientists and mental health care professionals have been talking about how this is the loneliest generation in our history. The advent of the internet and the computer have allowed people to unintentionally self-isolate and discover too late that they have no real friendships or human connections. Joining Amaranth lets you physically and emotionally connect with people who can reverse those feelings.

"Many Courts not only meet for their meeting night, generally once a month, they also organize social gatherings for dinner together or crafting or quilting or, often, putting on a fundraiser. Engaging with them in any of these activities helps you form a real human connection with people who care about your well-being and want you to succeed in your life. They are about YOU."

This is what I would tell someone I am trying to interest in the Order of the Amaranth.

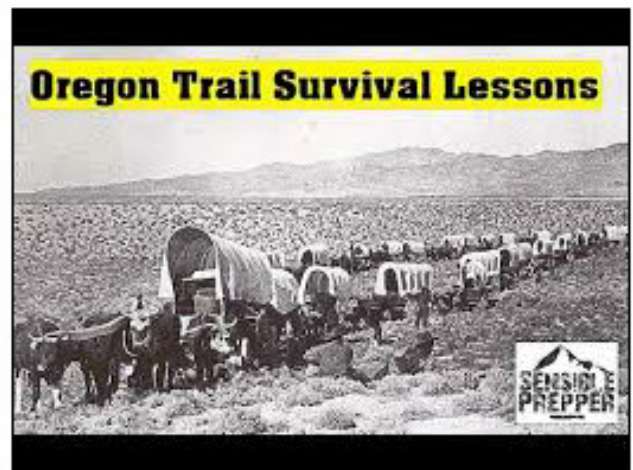
Warder: Honored Lady (Sir Knight) Sentinel, this Court is closed.

Honor the men in your life—Building men up wherever men and women live and work and spend time together is our responsibility. All of us respond positively to kindness and appreciation, men included. If you acknowledge the good in a man, he will often try to live up to it. So here are some ways to honor the men in your life and let them know they really matter.

Make a point to regularly say thank you

- Saying thank you is very simple, but we don't do it enough. So, think of the things, big and small, you can thank the men in your life for ... their talent, hard work, care, humor, their love, the list goes on.

- Tell your children positive things about their father in front of him.

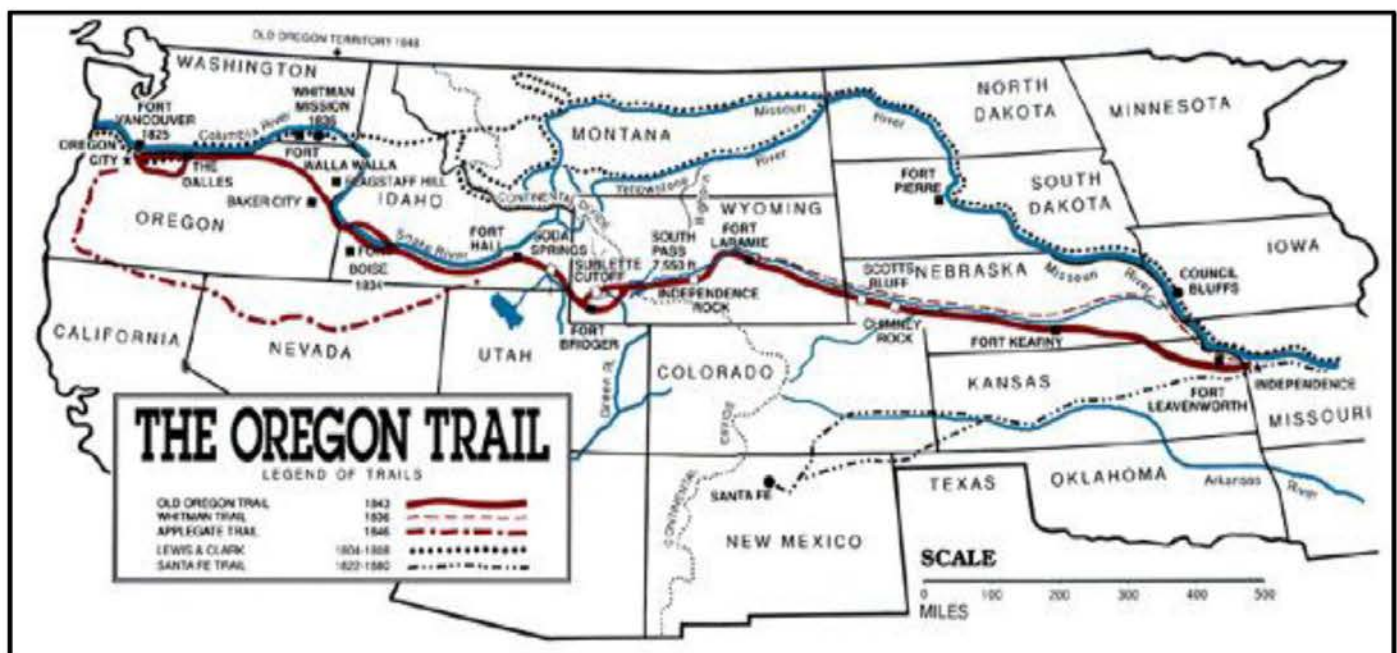
Encourage time for friendships, exercise and prayer

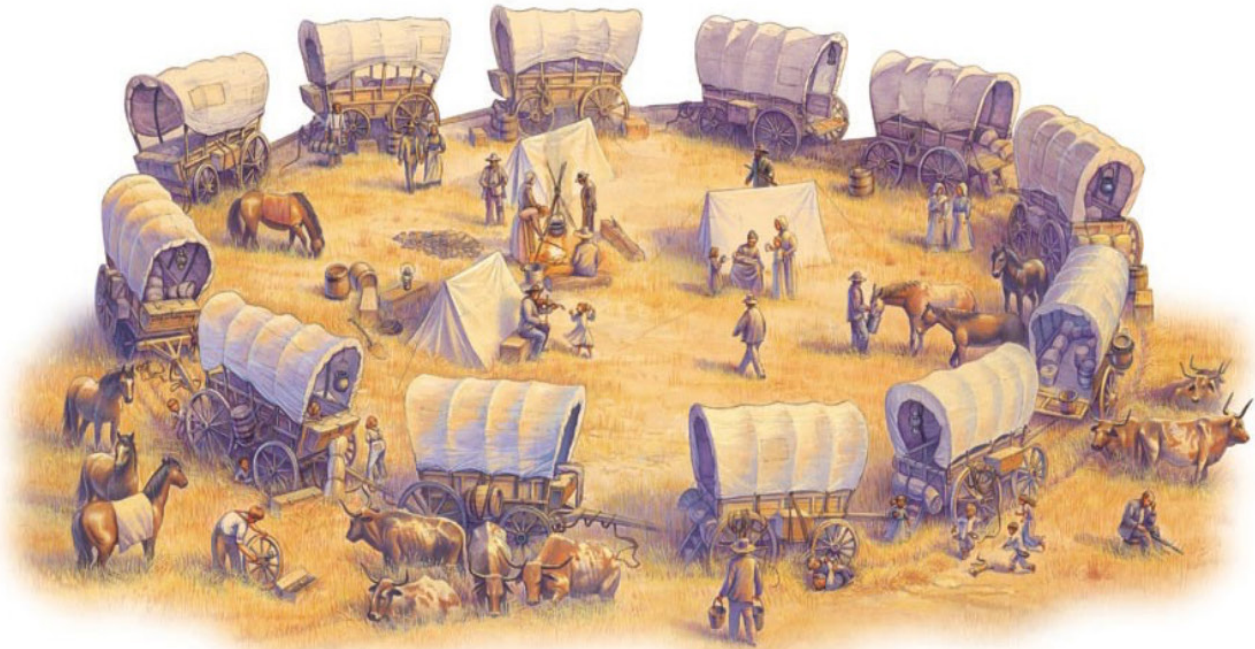

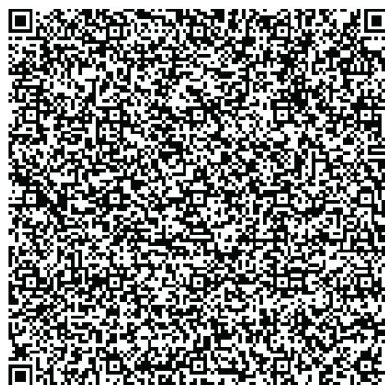
